History:

Two persons recorded in this cemetery are also recorded in Hopewell Cemetery. The information on their burial here is from Johnson's "History of Cooper County, Mo." We only recently recorded Hopewell Cemetery from the stones and found a marker there for these two graves. We think it very possible they were first buried in this small cemetery; then, later re-interred at Hopewell Baptist Church Cemetery, as has often been done. It is highly probable that there were other burials in this cemetery. Information in blue is from Justin Watkins or Missouri State Death Records.

There are three parcels of land in Sections 26 and 27 in Hugh Baxter's name. The cemetery symbol is in the middle parcel, in the SW Quarter of Section 26.

Cox	H. J.; born 18 May 1861 in Missouri; died 17 Nov 1918 in Kelley Township, Cooper County, Missouri; buried 19 Nov 1918; son of James (born Tennessee) and Sallie née Baxter Cox (born Missouri); single; farmer; informant James Pullie, Tipton, Missouri
Maples	Lanie née Larimore; born 09 Apr 1885 in Cooper County, Missouri; died 21 Apr 1924 in Bunceton Township, Cooper County, Missouri; daughter of William H. and Amanda T. née Hinkle Larimore; wife of John R. Maples
Richey	John R; born 03 Aug 1855 in Kentucky; died 21 March 1917 in Kelly Township, Cooper County, Missouri; aged 82 years; came to Cooper County after the Civil War; a Confederate Soldier; husband of Margaret née Keeton Richey; may have lived in St. Clair County, Missouri; also recorded in Hopewell Cemetery
Richey	Margaret née Keyton; born 04 Mar 1833 in Cooper County, Missouri; died 03 Jan 1910 in Kelly Township, Cooper County, Missouri; aged 77 years; daughter of William and Margaret Keyton; wife of John R. Richey
