**History:**

Thomas Dillard Byler, who was the son of Thomas Byler, who had come here in territorial days and had entered a tract of land in what is now Clarks Fork township, and had spent the remainder of his life and at the time of his death was buried on this farm there. Thomas D. Byler made his home on the farm now owned by Henry Muntzel and died there in 1876 being 76 years of age.

Based on the above information from The History of Cooper County, Missouri by Johnson; I place this cemetery at the above mentioned location. This land belong to Christ Muntzel in 1877 and contains a cemetery symbol that not can be accounted for other than belong to this cemetery.

The records of the Cooper County Historical Society place this cemetery at T-47-N, R-15-W, Section 29, southeast quarter of the southwest quarter.
