History:

A Mr. Roger Byler of Texas has told of an old Byler Family Cemetery on the old Muntzel Farm, just south of "Windsor Place"; south of Rankin's Mill where some of his family was buried. It has since been practically destroyed. Mr. Byler has had these stones removed to the Pisgah Cemetery at Pisgah, Missouri.

Byler	Joseph D.; died 21 Jul 1858; in the 85th year of his life. He was a native of Pennsylvania and came to Cooper County, Missouri in 1817.
Peters	Catherine née Byler; died 16 Nov 1857; in the 72nd year of her life; a sister of Joseph D. Byler
Peters	Samuel; no dates; Foreman of the first Grand Jury of Cooper County, Missouri; stone repaired in 197-.
