History:

This cemetery was recorded on May 17, 1967 by Mr. Charles Leonard and a person wishing to remain unknown. There may have been more graves here than these above as some of the older residents of Bell Air recall that at one time there was a fence around this plot and probably more markers than remain now.

Corum	Gilla H. née Tevis; wife of Henry Corum; born 06 Oct 1799; died 21 Jun 1874; Note: Henry and Gilla on the same stone
Corum	Henry; born 25 Jul 1795; died 17 Sep 1883
Ewing	Ann Moor; born 05 Jan 1846; died 27 Jan 1846; daughter of William Caldwell and Lucretia Perry née Corum Ewing; Note: Lucretia Perry Corum was a daughter of Henry and Gilla Corum
Simpson	America Read; died 18 Jan 1840; first wife of Charles Francis Simpson; Note: His second wife was Mar Ann Corum; grand-daughter of John Corum; probably a brother of Henry; This information supplied by Mr. Gordon Bryan of Boulder, Colorado. He said that America Read was probably buried here; though no marker for her remains. Mr. Bryan is the great-great-grandson of Charles Francis Simpson. He was searching for the grave of John Corum.
Unknown	A large stone which was lying face down was later raised and found to bear the same names and dates as for Henry and Gilla Corum
