Road Directions: six to seven miles southwest of Boonville, Missouri; where Route #135 goes south off I-70, turn north (right); then west (left) and go a very short distance. Here is a road to north which goes by a farm that was owned by the Hurd families.

History:

There is no cemetery symbol on the family homestead to show the location of these burials. The location chosen for the cemetery is near to the old Hurd house. Their children are buried in the Old Lamine Cemetery, Walnut Grove Cemetery, as well as Jones Chapel Cemetery. The latter is about one mile east of the homestead.

Hurd	Harriett née Collins; born Jul 1837; died after of her husband; wife of Jesse Hurd; buried in the family cemetery on farm near the Lamine Bridge
Hurd	Jesse; died 13 May 1904; aged 74 years; husband of Harriett née Collins Hurd; married 11 Jan 1855 in Cooper County, Missouri; died at his home near Lamine Bridge, west of Boonville, Missouri and buried on the farm.
Hurd	Jim; son of Jesse and Harriett née Collins Hurd; buried in family cemetery on the farm.
