History:

Henry and Elizabeth were both natives of Germany. The mother and wife died in her native land in 1852; three years later, Henry Kahle came to America with his family and settled in St. Louis County, Missouri. In 1857, he came to Cooper County and settled in Clark's Fork Township. He died in 1860 and his remains are buried in a private burial ground on the Muntzel Farm. From History of Cooper County Missouri by W. F. Johnson 1919.

Some years ago, one of the descendants of this Muntzel family, was searching for the grave of his great grandparents – he report that he thought they had been buried on the old home place. Sometime after 1991 Mr. Bill Young, who owns this piece of land, told how he has been told by a friend who knew this place years ago, that there was a cemetery there, with markers, but he says he can not find any signs of it at the present.
