Directions:

Road directions: From Main Street in Bunceton, Missouri, take the gravel road that goes south, off of Main Street, about half-way up the hill on west edge of town and go about 3 1/2 miles south to the Logan Walther's place.

History:

This cemetery has almost disappeared; a stock fence separates the only two remaining, although, there are signs that other stones were once there.

A. W. McCurdy was appointed as a delegate from Kelly Township to attend a pro-slavery convention to be held at Lexington, Missouri on July 12, 1855.
