

Editor's Note

When I first started this project it was with the intention to make Helen Nadine née Stone Woodruff's manuscript on the Meisburger, Diringer, and Back family machine readable. This was to be a simple project to use an optical character recognition program on a scanned file. Well that part was fairly simple. What I soon discovered was that not only was the manuscript easy to get lost in, but information was often repeated. Furthermore when the information was repeated it was not the same in the different sections of the manuscript. So I was faced with the decision to leave everything intact or clean up Helen's manuscript.

I decided to clean up the manuscript for a variety of reasons. I also determined to leave as much of Helen's footprint intact that I possibly could. One of the first things that I did was whenever a new person's information was to be presented; I added the surname in front of the Christian name. That allows one to scroll through a large manuscript and know what person is being discussed. Secondly I eliminated all duplicate sections of information, including that from family group sheets. The same person will not be found in say both the Diringer and Meisburger families with complete family information. In instances of conflicting data, for example birth dates, I used the latest information found in Helen's files; or that which from my own research was known to be the accepted datum.

The reader must recognize that this is the family genealogy for Helen Nadine née Stone Woodruff. It was not written to include all descending or allied families. That is your job to include those families. That is what I have done and many others have done. There are many researchers working on family lines that connect back to the individuals listed in Helen's manuscript.

Finally, realize that the information included in this manuscript is not always correct. There are errors and I did not bother to correct them. Maybe I should have noted them, but that was just too much work. For the same reason the base documentation that supports Helen's manuscript are also not included in this online machine readable document.

So have fun and enjoy and use what the find here.

My Maternal Ancestry research led me to find that along with German forefathers, there was a French background.

MAXAMIN (MAXAMILION) MEISBURGER with wife HANNAH (MARGARET ANNA) and eight children arrived in Boonville, Missouri on May 27, 1848. IGNATIUS DIRINGER and wife MAGDALENE and family were on the same boat to America. Both families settled in the area.

There is much research to be done on these families and a real challenge to someone in the future. I only hope that what I have found will be a guideline for someone in the future.

DIRINGER

Generation I, Diringer

I) DIRINGER, FRANCOIS JOSEPH, born about 1772. Lived and probably married in Gueberschwyr, District of Ribeauvllle, France. Married ANNA MARIE BIRINGER, who was born about 1769. Joseph died 25-June-1811 as stated in marriage record of IGNACE.

This entry also verifies this death date: "JACQUES BIRINGER, as brother-in-law declared FRANCOIS JOSEPH DIRINGER, aged 39 years, died in his domicile house situated out the town gate."

ANNA MARIE BIRINGER, widow of JOSEPH DIRINGER died here (Herrlisheim) in her house "out of the southern gate" at the age of 64."

1) DIRINGER, IGNACE (See **Generation II, Diringer**)

II) DIRINGER, IGNACE, born 12-August-1804 in Gueberschwyr, District of Ribeauville, France. (24 thermidor year 12).

Married on 10-May-1832 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France to MARIE MADELEINE BACH, who was born on 27-October-1804 (the vendemiare year 13 of French Republic) in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France to JEAN LOUIS BACH, a SCHOOL MASTER and MARIA MADELEINE BRAUNEISEN.

JEAN LOUIS BACH was born about 1767. His death record reads: "Died 2-February-1829 here (Herrlisheim, France). MICHEL BACH, School master, 30 years old, son of the deceased and FRANCOIS JOSEPH BACH, son aged 31 years, who declared that JEAN LOUISE BACH, BACH, School Master, husband of MARIE MADELEINE BRAUNEISEN died :in this place at the age of 62 years."

IGNATIUS (IGNACE) and wife MARIE MADELEINE arrived in Boonville, Cooper County, Missouri in May of 1848 along with the MEISBURGER Family.

IGNACE, along with other citizens in Boonville organized the BOONVILLIE WINE COMPANY, the largest Vineyard In the area. The Area was soon known to have the best vineyards in the country.

Later he moved into Boonville and took up Blacksmithing. This business continued in the family for many years. I have no death dates on either, but they are buried in the Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri. The markers appear to be on the lot of MICHAEL DIRINGER. [Editor's Note: Ignace died 08 Apr 1872 in Boonville and she died on 25 Jul 1875 in Boonville, Missouri]

1) DIRINGER, MARY MAGDALENA (See **Generation V, Meisburger**)

2) DIRINGER, ROSA, born about 1835 in Herrlisheim, France. Married in Boonville, Missouri about 1856 to ANDREW "ANDY" GANTER, who was born about 1835 in Baden, Germany. He was by trade a Brick and Stone Contractor. He died 5-October-1890 and she died 9-December-1912. Both are buried in the Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri.

A) GANTER, LEWIS (LOUIS), born 21-November-1861 in Boonville, Missouri. He was married to SOPHIE, who was born 30-July-1864. LOUIS died 26-January-19'47 and SOPHIE died 5-December-1954. Both are buried in the Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Mo.

B) GANTER, FRANK, born in December of 1859.

3) DIRINGER, JERDOWIE (LEWIS), born about 1837/38 in France. Married LOUISA in 1869. He was a Blacksmith. He died in 1914 in Boonville, Missouri and she in 1933. Both are buried in the Catholic Cemetery at Boonville, Missouri.

A) DIRINGER, MARY, born in November of 1877.

B) DIRINGER, WILLIAM, born in June of 1882.

C) DIRINGER, FLORA, born November of 1884.

D) DIRINGER, CLARENCE, born in August of 1887.

E) DIRINGER, FERINAND, born in April of 1891.

F) DIRINGER, VIOIA, born April of 1893.

G) DIRINGER, ADELAID, married on 9-November-1898 to W. J. STRETZ in Cooper County by Theodore Kussman (Priest).

4) DIRINGER, IGNATIOUS (IGNACE), born about 1842 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. He enlisted in Calvary for Civil War at Waynesville, Missouri on 16-August-1863. He was mustered in on August-18-1863 in Rolla, Missouri. Remustered in as a Veteran on 6-September-1864. In 1863 he was 21 years old, 5' 5" tall, black hair, brown eyes, and of fair complexion.

5) DIRINGER, MICHAEL, born 12-November-1843 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. Married 29-October-1868 to MARGARET MITCHELL (MEISTRELL) by E. Hillner (Priest). He was a Wagon Manufacturer in Boonville. Joined the Home Guard in July of 1861. Discharged 21-December-1864. He died 29-October-1907 in Boonville, Missouri. Margaret born 24-December-1843 in Chariton, Missouri and died 15-September-1917. Both are buried in the Catholic Cemetery at Boonville, Missouri.

A) DIRINGER, FRANK I. was born 21-December-1869 and died 16-February-1870. Buried in Catholic Cemetery in Boonville.

B) DIRINGER, JOHN, born in 1870. Died 12-September-1872. Buried in Catholic Cemetery at Boonville, Missouri.

C) DIRINGER, MARY C., born 1-March-1873. Died 15-June-1873. Buried in Catholic Cemetery at Boonville, Missouri.

D) DIRINGER, HENRY JOSEPH, born 2-October-1876. Died 21-April-1881. Buried in Catholic Cemetery in Boonville.

E) DIRINGER, FRANK J., born in 1873. Was a Musician in the Spanish American War.

F) DIRINGER, EMILIA (AMELIA), born May of 1880. Married DAVID E. KELCH of Hamilton, Ohio on 17-January-1907. She was a Milliner in Boonville, Missouri.

G) DIRINGER, CATHERINE (STELIA), born in 1881.

6) DIRINGER, ANNA MARY, born 10-October-1847, perhaps in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France, but more likely on the boat. Died 19-July-1914 and is buried in the Catholic Cemetery at Boonville. She was "deaf" and because of this could not talk. She was a fine Seamstress. Her family was often amused at her. When she made a mistake in her sewing, she would stamp her foot and say "Damn."

Generation I, Meisburger

These first pages of this Manuscript are an update on the material I had written in 1981. I was fortunate to get in touch with a lady in France, Madame Jean Peres, who has been very helpful. The first record, I now have of the MEISBURGER family is from Harrstett, Upper-Rhin, France. Later information is from Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France.

The origin of the MEISBURGER family may have been in Busch in Turgau, France and the name may have been spelled at that time, MOSBURGER. There is a record of a Catharina Mosberger dying in Hattstatt, France in 1779. She was the daughter of Mathias and was originally from Busch, Turgau, Germany. There is a possibility that Mathias is Pierre Meisburger and that Catharina is the same as Pierre's daughter of the same name who was born 21 Sep 1867. There is no marriage record of Pierre and Salone née Creitzer Meisburger found in Hattstatt records.

I) MEISBURGER, PIERRE, a mason by profession, married to SALONE CREITZER (CREUTZER), who died on 1-May-1782 in Hattstatt, France.

II) MEISBURGER, PIERRE (PETER), born in about 1761 in Hattstatt, France. A mason by profession. Married on 8-January-1789 in Hattstatt, France to MARIA BARBARA BAUR, who was born 13-May-1758, daughter of CHRISTAIN and BARBARA (FELTZ) BAUR. Witnesses to the wedding were; CHRISTAIN BAUR (Father), JOHANNES (Brother), and FENDEL HARTENBECK (Grandfather).

BARBARA BAUR MEISBURGER died in Herrlisheim, France on 9-April-1795 (the 20 germinal year 3 of the France Republic).

CHRISTAIN BAUR was the son of JOSEPH BAUR and ??? OBERMORSCHWIHR. The father of BARBARA FELTZ BAUER was GEORGE FELTZ. The Parish Records in Hattstatt, France for the children of CHRISTAIN BAUR (WINE GROWER) ARE:

- 1) BAUR, MARIA BARBARA, born 13-May-1758 (wife of Pierre Meisburger).
- 2) BAUR, MARIE MADELEINE, born 21-September-1760.
- 3) BAUR, JEAN, born 4-January-1763.
- 4) BAUR, Elisabeth was born 20 Nov 1764. Elisabeth is missing from family group sheets and most of Helen Stone Woodruff's papers except her base records.
- 5) BAUR, LOUIS, born 24-August-1768.
- 6) BAUR, MARIA ANNA, born 16-September-1771.
- 7) BAUR, CHRISTAIN, born 2-June-1775.
- 8) BAUR, ANNA MARIA, born 17-May-1777.

There is recorded a 2nd marriage of PIERRE MEISBURGER in May of 1795 to ANNA MARIE LOUISE (LOU), daughter of SEBASTIN and HELENA (MEYER (LOUISA (LOU)).

At the death of PIERRE MEISBURGER on 1-June-1831, at the age of 72, in Herrlisheim, the widow is named as CATHARINA BINDER and he was living in his house in the place known as "graben" on the grove of this place.

- A) MEISBURGER, PIERRE, born 1802 (18 germinal year 10 of French Republic.)

III) MEISBURGER, ERASME (MAX) was born 29/31-May-1793 in Hattstatt, Upper-Rhin, France. The birth record reads: "Was born ERASMUS, son of PETER MEISBURGER, mason by profession of this place (Hattstatt) and of BARBARA BAUR, his wife legitimate. Godfather: is; JOSEPH HINNIGER, age 32 years. Godmother is; MARIA ANNA S'TEINBRUCKER."

Married 10-January-1827 in Herrlisheim, France to MARIE ANNE SCHECK, who was born 14-February-1800 (25 pluviöse year 80) in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France; the daughter of MATHIS and MARIE ANNE SCHENCK.

Mathias Schenck was married 09 Apr 1795 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France to Marie Anne (born 1764 and died 26 Feb 1808 in Herrlisheim). Her death was recorded as: "MARIE ANNE SCHENCK, wife of MATHIS SCHENCK, as declared by neighbors, was 44 years old, at her house number 45 in this place known as "graben."

HISTORY of COOPER COUNTY, MISSOURI by W.F. JOHNSON, published in 1919 stated. "MAX MEISBURGER, with his family of eight children arrived in Boonville, Missouri in 1848. MAX

MEISBURGER had served for six years as a soldier in the army of the great Napoleon and was very proud of the medals he had received for bravery. During the progress of the Franco-Prussian War (1870-73) he kept posted through the French papers which he received. When the Prussian Victory was announced, he, with clenched fists and tear dimmed eyes, declared 'If our great Napoleon had lived, he and I would never have tolerated the Prussians to lord it over our Beloved France'. He expressed the belief that his grandchildren would live to see the happy day when Alsace Lorraine would be liberated from the Prussian domination. During the time of America's participation in the World War, which resulted in the return to France of the 'lost' province, nine of his great-grandsons answered the call to the front and when the Armistice was declared in the fall of 1918, six more were waiting for the next call."

There is a Deed in the Courthouse at Boonville, Cooper County, Missouri, stating 1-Aug-1852, MAXAMIN MEISBERGER bought a lot of ground in the City of Boonville from Jeremiah Rice for One hundred and seventy five dollars.

The 1860 Census for Cooper County list MAX MEISBURGER as a Vine Grower, with wife, HANNAH.

The only Christening in the Catholic Church at Boonville that I was able to find "MARY MAGDALENA MEISBURGER, daughter of John Meisburger and Maria Magdalena Diringer born 31—Jul—1863. Sponsors: MAX MEISBURGER, MARGARET ANNA MEISBURGER". I have found no record of the death of either Agnes Meriwether, a direct descendant of Theresa Meisburger Immels, says she had been told that HANNAH (MARGARET ANNA) was buried on the lot of her son, Joseph, in the Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri. She also said she had been told that MAX had died in the home of his daughter, Therese Immele and was buried in the St. Martins Cemetery near Pilot Grove, Missouri. No one I have talked with has been able to identify more than four of the eight children.

There were suppose to have been eight children come to America with MAX Meisburger, but no one had identified but four. There are eight recorded births in Herrlisheim, but only seven living at the time they departed for America.

1) MEISBURGER, MARTIN, born 15-November-1827 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France.

2) MEISBURGER, MARIA ANNA, born 30-September-1829 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France.

3) MEISBURGER, CATHERINE, born 24-Dec-1831 Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. Married FRANCIS JOSEPH IMMELE JR., son of Francis Joseph and Anna Marie (Boshea) Immele on 20 Apr 1856 in Boonville, Cooper County, Missouri. He was a wagon maker, born 12-Apr-1829 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. He had come with his parents to America about the year of 1851. He died 6-Sep-1911 in Boonville, Missouri. Catherine died 3-Mar-1899 in Boonville, Cooper County, Missouri. Both are buried in St. Martins Cemetery near Pilot Grove, Missouri.

Francis Louis Immele, a brother to Francis Joseph, was born 22 Mar 1827 in Alsace Lorraine, France. His parents were married on 12 Jan 1825 in Hattstatt, Haute-Rhin, France. "1825 the 2nd Sunday of January were proclaimed and married he 12 January: Joseph Immele aged 31 years, son of deceased Thomas Immele and of Theresia Falermann, a winegrower and Anna Maria Buche, daughter born in Blotzheim, aged 32, of deceased Francois Buche and of Madeleine Dustaty, both in Boltzheim in their lifetime." Anna Marie's last name is also spelled Buche.

A) IMMELE, LOUIS, born 13-May-1859 in Boonville, Missouri. Died Oct-1932 and was buried in Holy Cross Cemetery in San Diego, California on 05 Oct 1942. It is said he was married and had one son.

B) IMMELE, MARY, born in May of 1857 in Boonville, Cooper County, Missouri. She was a Dressmaker in Boonville in 1900. She died Jul-1933 and was buried in Holy Cross Cemetery in San Diego, California on 19 Jul 1933. Never married.

C) IMMELE, ANNA, born in March of 1861 in Boonville, Cooper County, Missouri. She was a Milliner in Boonville in 1900. She married LESTER ???. Died Jan-1936 and was buried in Holy Cross Cemetery in San Diego, California on 16 Jan 1936, No issue.

4) MEISBURGER, JOHN BAPTISTE. (See **Generation IV, Meisburger**)

5) MEISBURGER, JOSEPH was born 8 Mar 1837 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France and died in the same place on 5 Jun 1845.

6) MEISBURGER, THERESE, born 17 Apr 1841 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. Married FRANCIS LOUIS IMMELE on 16-Jul-1859 in Boonville, Missouri. He was also the eldest son of Francis Joseph and Anna Marie (Boshea) Immele. He was born 22 Mar 1827 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France and when his parents and younger brother came to America, he remained in France. He was serving as a cannoneer in the French Army in Africa. After six years of service he joined his family in Boonville. He was a wagon maker and he and his brother had a business together for some years. He died 9-Feb-1881 in Boonville. Therese died 15-Feb-1917 in Boonville, Missouri. Both are buried in St. Martins Cemetery near Pilot Grove, Missouri.

A) IMMELE, CHARLES, born 20-Oct-1861 in Boonville, Missouri. Married 20-May-1885 to ROSELINDA JOSEPHINE GROSCH. She was born 13-Oct-1859 and died 22-Jan-1931. He died 22-May-1925 in Boonville, Missouri. Both are buried in Montrose, Missouri.

B) IMMELE, JOSEPH, born 23-May-1864 in Boonville, Missouri. Died 6-Jun-1906 in Boonville, Missouri. Buried in St. Martins Cemetery, near Pilot Grove, Missouri. Never married.

C) IMMELE, JOHN BAPTISTE, born 7-Jul-1866 in Cooper Co., Missouri. Married ANNA CATHERINE MARTIN on 6-Sep-1898. Taught for over 50 years in Cooper Co., Missouri. Anna Catherine was born 9-Nov-1873, the daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth (Esser) Martin and died 23-Feb-1960 in Pilot Grove, Missouri. He died 26-Sep-1942 in Pilot Grove, Missouri. Both are buried in St. Joseph Cemetery in Pilot Grove, MISSOURI.

D) IMMELE, MARY LOUISE, born 18-Sep-1872 in Cooper Co., Missouri. Married #1 HENRY JOSEPH HANRAHAN. He died in 1900 and she married #2. RUBIN MAHANEY. She died 18-Sep-1941 in Tulsa, Oklahoma and is buried in the Calvary Cemetery in Tulsa, Ok.

E) IMMELE, MARY THERESA, born 2-Jul-1874 in Boonville, Missouri. She died 6-Feb-1965 in Boonville, Missouri and is buried in the Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri. She never married.

F) IMMELE, CATHERINE, born 5-Oct-1876 in Boonville, Missouri. Married LESTER OSCAR ZEIGEL on 6-Apr-1896 in Boonville, Missouri. He was born 18-Sep-1878, the son of Henry and Malinde (McGuire) Zeigel. He was a Farmer and Stockman. He died 2-Dec-1964 or 2 Dec 1865 and is buried in Walnut Grove Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri. She died 6-Feb-1965 and is buried in St. Martins Cemetery near Pilot Grove, Missouri.

G) IMMELE, SOPHIA M. was born 2-Mar-1879 in Boonville, Missouri. Married EMMET F. HALING on 24-Apr-1908 in Boonville, Missouri. He was born in Warrenton, Missouri. in 1882. He died 18-Nov-1955 in Ft Worth, Texas and she died 2-Jun-1950 in Ft. Worth, Texas. Both are buried in Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Fort Worth, Texas.

H) IMMELE, LOUIS MAXIMULIAN, born 9-Aug-1881 in Boonville, Missouri. Died 10-Jul-1974. Never married.

7) MEISBURGER, NICOLAS was born 13 Oct 1844 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France.

8) MEISBURGER, JOSEPH, born 28-Oct-1846 or 1847 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. Married HELENA HUBER on 27-Jun-1872 in Boonville, Missouri. He was a Blacksmith. He lived in Boonville until about 1882, when he moved with his family to Fayette, Missouri. Helen was born 4-Jul-1847 in Missouri the daughter of John and Elizabeth Huber. She died 28-Apr-1901 in Boonville, Missouri. He died 19-May-1902 in Boonville, Missouri and was buried on 21 May 1902; both are buried in the Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri.

A) MEISBURGER, JOHN HENRY, 26-Mar-1872 in Boonville, Missouri. Married BETTIE KELLOGG on 23-Oct-1907. He died 15-Apr-1936.

B) MEISBURGER, MARY ELIZABETH (MAYME), born 5-Dec-1876. Died 17-Mar-1963 in St. Louis, Missouri. Buried in Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri. Never married.

C) MEISBURGER, WILLIAM JOSEPH, born in 1879 in Boonville, Missouri. Married ALICE SOMMERS in Kansas City, Missouri. Died 9-Feb-1955 in Kansas City, Missouri.

D) MEISBURGER, RAYMOND, died in infancy.

E) MEISBURGER, ALBERTINE (TINA), born in 1875 in Boonville, Missouri. Married MELVILLE WATT and lived in St. Paul.

Generation IV, Meisburger

IV) MEISBURGER, JOHN BAPTISTE, born 29-Jun-1834 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. He was a wagon maker. Married MARY MAGDALENA DIRINGER, daughter of Ignatius and Magdalena Diringer on 12-Apr-1857 in Boonville, Missouri.

Mary Magdalena was born 9-March-1834 in Herrlisheim, Haute-Rhin, France. She and John lived most of their married life in Bunceton, Kelly Twsp, Cooper County, Missouri. Their parents had come to America on the same boat and had arrived in Boonville on 27-May-1848. Both families had come from the area in France, known as Haute Rhine. John Meisburger was in failing health for several years and took his own life on 11-

Jun-1903. The funeral was held in the home of Michael Diringer in Boonville, Missouri. He was buried on 14 Jun 1903 in Sts Peter and Paul Catholic Church Cemetery, Boonville, Cooper County, Missouri.

Mary Magdalena died in the home of her son, Joseph in Kansas City on 29-Jan-1917 and is buried beside her husband in the Catholic Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri. She was buried on 31 Jan 1917.

1) MEISBURGER, LOUISE MAGDALENA (See **Generation IV, Back**)

2) MEISBURGER, JOHN LOUIS (LEWIS), born 27-Oct-1860 in Florence, Morgan Co., Missouri. Married 31-Dec-1880 in Boonville, Missouri to EMMA PARKER. He was living in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma in 1903 and I have a picture of three of his children taken in Greenville, Texas. He died 5-Feb-1914.

3) MEISBURGER, MARY MAGDALENA (ANNA) (See **Generation II, Back**)

4) MEISBURGER, FRANK N., born 1-Jan-1866 in Tipton, Moniteau County, Missouri. Went to Kansas City when he was seventeen years old and became a messenger boy for Western Union. He attended college in Sedalia, Missouri and studied Telegraphy. He was superintendent of the West Bottoms Office during the flood of 1903, delivering the last message from the office in a row boat. In later years he was a Contractor and builder in Kansas City. Married MARY LANDRIGAN in 1893. She died when his only son was six weeks old in Aug of 1895 in Kansas City, Missouri. He married KATHERINE SULLIVAN in 1902. She was died in 1929 in Kansas City, Missouri and he died in 1955 in Kansas City, Missouri at the age of 89 and is buried in St. Mary's Cemetery in Kansas City, Missouri.

He died 10-Oct-1957 his funeral was held at "Little Church of the Flowers" and conducted by Dr. Joseph P. Haggerty of the North Hollywood Funeral Director, Forest Lawn Mortuary. He is buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery in Glendale, California on 15 Oct 1957. I have no further information on Mary Lee, she was alive in 1953.

No further information at this time. He died before 1953.

7) MEISBURGER, JOSEPH ALBERT, born 1-Sep-1874 in Tipton, Moniteau County, Missouri. Married 22-Nov-1899 to LENA SOPHIA NORRIS in Boonville, Missouri by J. H. Allen, Minister. Lena was born 17-May-1878 in Greenridge, Pettis County, Missouri, her mother died when she was born and she was raised by her Aunt and Uncle by the name of Allison. They lived in Sweet Springs, Missouri for awhile, moved to Auliville, Missouri and later into Kansas City, Missouri. He retired from the Postal Service in 1939. His mother lived in his home for the last ten years of her life. He died 25-Jan-1953 in Kansas City, Missouri. Services were held in the Newcomer Chapel. She died 27-Mar-1958 in Kansas City, Missouri. Services were held in the Newcomer Chapel. Both are buried in Forest Hill Cemetery in Kansas City, Missouri.

He sent me this story about his G-Grandmother, told to him by his Grandfather (Joe). "There is one incident related to me by Grandpa, you may or may not have heard. It was before he was born and concerned one of his older sisters, who was a baby during the Civil War. Missourians were constantly visited by soldiers of both sides and they would of course hide valuables as best they could. G-Grandmother Meisburger had a reasonably large sum of money for some special purchase when she was visited by a troop of soldiers. She prepared dinner for them while they searched the house. The Senior Officer held the baby on his lap for a while. They ate and left without incident. The Senior Officer had the money in his lap most of the time, Grandmother had put the money in the baby's diaper."

8) MEISBURGER, EDWARD MICHAEL, born 10-Jan-1877 in Bunceton, Cooper County, Missouri. He worked for the Western Union in Galveston, Texas during the flood of 1900. He was cited for Rescue Activities. He retired in 1938, after forty five years with American Telephone and Telegraph Company. Married 9-Jun-1907 to BERTHA (BERT) GOFF. He died 15-Jul-1961 in the home of his Daughter-in-Law in Wamega, Wyandotte, Kansas. He was buried in Calvary Cemetery in Kansas City, Missouri on 18 Jul 1961.

My desire to know about my German Ancestry has led into an interesting search, where I have met so many people, who have helped in many ways. Some are relatives, others have become very dear and giving friends. My thanks go out to each and everyone of them.

Credit for my interest must surely go to Laurie Gail Schler of Boonville, Missouri. She had searched for material on her side of the BACK FAMILY for sometime. Records on other BACKS continued to turn up until she became interested in our family. She was very generous and always helpful.

The mystery of the spelling BACH or BACK was solved with a letter from the Evangelische Kirchengemeinde of Rettert, West Germany.

"We have all records about the BACK Family. This Family was, and still is BACK." From the Archives in

Wiesbaden, West Germany.

"At Rettert, JOHANN BACK appears in 1648. After that JOHANNES BACK 1677 - 1694."

Later GEORGE FRIEDRICH BACK 1759-1768 and JOHANN PETER BACK Mayors (Schultheissen) of the village of Rettert in the area of Nassau (Nassauische).

There were eleven BACK families in Boonville, Missouri in the 1850's. All gave their birthplace as Rettert,

Nassau, Germany. I can only assume they were in some way related. All belonged to the German Evangelical Church and many were Sponsors for Christenings and Witnesses at Weddings in each others families. The families arrived in Boonville, Missouri from about 1845 through 1858. The Port of Entry for most was New Orleans, Louisiana. They would travel up the Mississippi River to St. Louis and then the Missouri River to Boonville.

The Evangelische Kirchengemeinde in the village of Rettert sent record that I will base the following

"JOHANN HEINRICH DEBUSMANN of Kordorf and MARIA ELISABETHA WEYL, widow of JOHANN ADAM GILL (Miller at Eigeshauser Mill) were married 14-Jun-1785."

There was also this record, "ANNA ELISABETHE born 24-Mar-1791 to JOHANN HEINRICH DEBUSMANN (Miller) and ELISABETHE KLOSS".

III) BACK, JOHANN ANTON PETER, born 30-Apr-1824 in Rettert, Nassau, Germany. He was a fine Cabinet Maker. Had a strong, beautiful voice and sang in the German Evangelical Lutheran Church Choir. Was probably among the first Trustees of the church when it was organized in 1860/91. He married CATHERINE WILHELMINA SOPHIE GEUER. There is a record of a marriage between them on 24-Dec-1857 in Boonville, Missouri. The marriage performed by C. L. Greiner and witnessed by Philip Back and Dorothea Friedrich Back. My mother and several other people I wrote to said they had been married in Germany in the spring of 1857. I found on the passenger list of the S.S. Johannesburg "Wilhelmine Back arrived in New Orleans on Feb-13-1857 on the ship S.S. Johannesburg." I did not find Anton's name. So they may have been married in the spring of 1856, and remarried in Boonville so their children would be American Citizens. [Editors Note: Some documents state that Sophie Wilhelmina Geuer was disowned by her family when she married Anton Back. That she never spoke English in her entire life; flatly refusing to speak anything other than German.]

Anton Peter Back made application for citizenship on July 17, 1865. I did not find where he received his papers. During the Civil War, he was a member of Captain Eppstein's Company A Boonville R Corp. Regiment, Missouri. H.Q. Military Record said June 20, 1861. Wounded in Battle at Boonville, Missouri. Mustered out 8-Dec-1862. Sick every since.

He died 3-Feb-1876 and is buried in the Sunset Hills Cemetery at Boonville, Missouri. Catharine Wilhelmina Sophia Geuer. He was born in Hoechst, Nassau, Germany on 13-Feb-1828. Her father was Johann Geuer, a Bookbinder. He was a Catholic, born in Cologn, Germany. Her mother was Caroline Luise Muller, born in Berlin and a Protestant. The name Johann was added at Baptism. The Godparent was Wilhelmina Klan of Rettert. After the death of Anton she returned to the Catholic Church and was a faithful and devoted member of the Church and the Sacred Heart Society. IV) BACK, PHILIP GOTTFRIED, born 1-Jan-1858 in Boonville, Missouri. Christened 31-Jan-1858. Sponsors were Gottfried Back and Catherine Neef. Confirmed 1-Jun-1873. He married **LOUISE MAGDALENA MEISBURGER**, daughter of John Baptiste and Mary Magdalena (Diringer) Meisburger on 29-Apr-1884. They were married by Rev. John A. Hoffman, pastor of S.S. Peter and Paul Church. The first year of their marriage, he served on the Police Force. At different times he made application and received license to operate a Dram Shop. He owned and sold barges on the Missouri River and several different pieces of property. He went into the Fuel Business. He had a wood and coal yard and added a Fuel Wagon (Red Tank Line Co.) drawn by horses. He delivered "Perfection Oil" and "Crown Gasoline" over town. This he sold to his brother-in-law, John Potter in August of 1893 when he decided to claim land in the Cherokee Strip Land Run. The Fuel Company remained in the Potter Family for many years.

This story found in the things of Anna Helen Back Stone after her death in 1955, probably tells the story of the early days in Oklahoma for him and his family best. "Mr. Back, with his brother-in-laws, Frank Meisburger and Dominicus Barnert made the race together in a heavy cart made out of the back wheels of a wagon. They drove two grey horses, named Dutch and Tony after two of his brothers. They had them shipped from the west and wasn't halter broke when they were unloaded at the Railroad station at Guthrie, Oklahoma in August of that year and they spent many hours breaking them to the cart. It took seven men to hitch them the day of the race. They made the start from Orlando. Mr. Back took a place two miles east of Billings, now owned by his son, Emil. Mr. Meisburger took the farm joining it on the east and Mr. Barnert, the one now owned by Mr. Pitts, south of Billings. They both turned their claims back as they did not like the country and wanted to go back to Missouri. Mr. Back dug a well on the bank of a bijou on the west side of his place that same afternoon. He soon built a two room house, 16' x 22', the first winter and hauled the material from Perry. The family moved

out in February of 1894. He had a small store on Red Rock Creek the first winter and a post office, called ARNOLD. (Arnold was established November 27, 1893 and changed to WHITEROCK Sept. 31, 1915). While trying to make a living in the store and post office, he had a man contest the claim. He bought the contestant off and he moved two miles north and bought a place so everyone was happy. Mr. Charles French was the contestant. The sod was broke by Ad and Joe Brown with a team of oxen. Watermelons grew well on the sod, also Kaffir Corn. There were very few lights to be seen at night as so many neighbors lived in dugouts. Fuel was very scarce. Wood was hauled from Red Rock, about 6 or 7 miles. You would buy a tree and then have to cut it up in stove lengths. Our chicken house was made of sod. The coyotes were plentiful and at night made a doleful sound.

The first school was moved from Perry and Mary Brown was the first teacher. Her father was a homesteader. The term was three months and the salary was twenty dollars. Two dollars was the price a teacher paid a week for board. Silk undies were a thing not known then. Underwear was made of flour sacks and you could sometimes still tell the brand of flour when they were on the clothesline.

Later Sunday School was started in the school house and also used for social activities. Literary and 'what debates'. Some of the phrases still stand out in my mind, such as 'Procrastination is the thief of time'. I recall so many times of seeing my father dressed as an old darky and singing 'Old Black Joe'. We also drove the cart and Old Dutch and went to Freemom and Lone Star to Literary. Our home school was Summit.

The first time we took eggs to market in the cart, the seat fell off and broke our first delivery of eggs. How well I remember stripping cane and hauling it to the sorghum mill about two miles away. And what good sorghum. Castor beans and broom corn were two more crops in the early days. Bins were made on hard ground and the beans put out to dry and when they opened they could well be called 'jumping beans'. We also raised peanuts and on cold winter nights we would all set around the fire and pick off peanuts, shell popcorn and sing songs. We always looked forward to Christmas for the relatives in Boonville would send us hard maple sugar, cheese and many more treats. Sometimes neighbors would gather and we would have taffy pulls, if we had extra sugar."

The farm was SW ½ Section 22 Twsp 24 Range 2W Noble County Claim #22 Bunch Creek Township. About 1909 they built a new house in Billings, Oklahoma. He had grocery and Mercantile stores most of the time up until his death. At one time his store was called "Wonder Mercantile" and later "P.G. Back Mercantile Co." Just before his death he had started the first "Help Yourself Grocery Store" in Billings, Oklahoma. He died in Enid, Oklahoma on 16-Nov-1922 and is buried along side his wife in the Billings Cemetery.
