Charles Biehle makes oath and says I am the identical individual who was Captain Of Company B of the Boonville Battalion United States Reserve Corp. Missouri Volunteers (also called Boonville Home Guards) called into the military service of the United States in the Department of Missouri by order of Major General John R. Fremont. That the above roll exhibits the true state of the Company for the person therein maintained. That the remarks opposite each officer and soldier name are accurate and true. And that the recapitulation exhibits the true state of the Company and that I have no knowledge of any member of said Company having received pay or anything in lieu thereof either from the state or General Fremont, except as stated in said roll. That I am personally acquainted with each officer and man whose name appears in the above roll and that they are and have been each and every one of them Loyal Citizens of the United States.

Those men marked with an (*) star opposite their names have quit the service on the specified time under a misapprehension that their service under this organization would not be recognized and compensated by the U. S. I would recommend that these men should be paid for the time they remained in service

By special order of Major John G. Fremont dated August 6 / 12 that Capt. Jos. A. Eppstein was authorized to organize a battalion including ? men ? Co. to serve as U. S. Reserve in Cooper County. After organizing Company A of this Battalion in conjunction with Company B ? - ? property of the Post made expeditions in the neighborhoods protecting Loyal Citizens

against Guerrillas. On the 10th of September information was received that an attack on the Post was contemplated upon which an order was given to Col. Jeff G. Davis, Commander at Jefferson City requesting him to be reinforced. On the 13 of September the Rebel Col. Brown of Saline County made the attack with a force of about 1000 strong. But was successfully repulsed after an hour and a half of fighting with a count of 100 killed and wounded. Among the killed were five officers of whom the most prominent was Col. Brown. Company A lost 1 killed and 4 wounded. Two days after the battle Col. Washington arrived there with the requested reinforcement who made an insertion (?) to the Salem Ridge in Picket duty learned that on the 16th Sep. A skirmish was made with the Rebel Pickets who lost one killed. Returned on the 22nd to Boonville.
