Jacob Smith died at his home in Char-  
lton county Saturday, March 30th. He  
was 80 years old, a veteran of the Mexi-  
can war, in which he was wounded, and  
was the father of Joseph Smith, of Pilot  
rope.

Sebern Graham Hazell died at his home  
in Tipton, Mo., Friday evening, March 29th.  
The funeral took place Sunday from the  
Baptist church to the city cemetery.

Decensed was born in Howard county,  
Missouri, March 26, 1819, and removed  
with his parents to Cooper county, settling  
at New Palestine. In 1859 he removed to  
Tipton. From 1883 to 1888 he resided in  
Boonville, and then returned to Tipton,  
where he had lived ever since. In 1861 he  
was a member of General Fremont's divi-  
sion and participated in the military opera-  
tions around Springfield.

His widow, who was a Miss Nancy Jolly  
of this county, and six children survive  
him: Judge J. E. Hazell, of California,  
Mo.; Miss Missouri Ann Hazell, of Tipton,  
Mo.; Mrs. Mary A. White, of Kansas City; Chas.  
W. Hazell, of Boonville; Mrs. Tabitha J.  
Phillips, of Moberly; and Miss Lucy E.  
Hazell, of Tipton. This was the first death  
in the family within the past 45 years.

"Uncle Sebe" Hazell, as he was affec-  
tionately called, belonged to the old pio-  
neer stock of Missourians, whose charac-  
teristics were rugged honesty, unremitting  
industry and helpfulness to others. He  
was held in high esteem for all these qual-  
ities, and his memory will be fondly cher-  
ished.
