DEATH OF MRS. H. B. HOPKINS.

Mrs. H. B. Hopkins died Monday, September 16th, at the family residence east of this city. She had been ill for some time with typhoid-pneumonia and death was not unexpected. Mrs. Hopkins was born February 9, 1829, in Hardin county, Ky., her maiden name being Rebecca Burcham. In 1854 she was married to Mr. Hopkins and they located in Texas. In 1856 they removed to this county, where they have since resided. Seven children were born of the union, three of whom are living — Emma S., wife of B. F. Anderson, Hal H., and Truman B., all of this county. Mrs. Hopkins had been a member of the Big Lick Baptist church for over forty years and was a most exemplary Christian woman. She was a devoted wife and mother and a kind neighbor, and will be greatly missed in the community. The funeral services were held Tuesday, the Rev. Isaac Good officiating, and the remains were interred in the Wooldridge family graveyard. To the bereaved family is extended the sympathy of a host of friends.

J. Monteville Carey died Friday, September 13th, at his home in the Mt. Hermon neighborhood, after a lingering illness of consumption.
