#### DEATH OF JOHN W. LEWIS.

John Will Lewis, a highly respected farmer living three-quarters of a mile southeast of Soleville, died Wednesday afternoon, September 19, at 2:30 o'clock. Mr. Lewis had been sick of malaria for several days, but his condition was not thought to be dangerous until a day or two before his death, when pneumonia developed.

Funeral services, conducted by Rev. F. C. Richards, were held at Antioch Baptist church, of which deceased was a member, yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Mr. Lewis was 57 years of age last March, and is survived by his wife, who was formerly Miss Jane Spillers, and by two daughters, Misses Lettie and Cammie, and four sons, Willie, Elzie, Charlie and Emmett.

Mr. Lewis was a good man and a good citizen, and his death has brought sorrow to many. To the grief-stricken family the Eagle extends sympathy, and trusts that the Heavenly Father may comfort them in the hour of sorrow. —Burdeton Eagle.
