DEATH OF AN OLD CITIZEN.

Rev. W. D. Mahan, one of the old landmarks of Boonville passed away at the Mahan House at 8:00 o'clock last Friday night, after an illness of about 24 hours.

The deceased was born in the State of Virginia on July 27, 1824 and came with his parents to Missouri in 1832, first settling in St. Louis. In 1845 he came to Boonville which place he has made his home until his death.

He was married in July 1851 to Miss Mattie Johnston, who survives him, and who also makes her home with her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Jo Green, at the Mahan House.

For many years the deceased was a minister of the Cumberland Presbyterian church, retiring some 12 years ago.

The funeral service was held Sunday afternoon at the Mahan House, Rev. W. H. Winton of the M. E. church South, officiating.

The remains were taken in charge by the I. O. O. F. of this city, of which order he was a member and conducted to the Walnut Grove cemetery for interment.

Besides his aged widow he is survived by an only daughter, Mrs. J. M. Green, to whom the ADVERTISER tenders its sympathy.
