DEATH OF MRS. CAREY.

Mrs. George Carey died at her home in Speed Friday morning, March 29 at 5:30 o'clock after a lingering illness.

Mrs. Carey, whose maiden name was Sarah Russell, was born in Virginia, August 4, 1837. At the age of 18 years she came to Missouri where she has since resided. In January 26, 1856, she was united in marriage to George Carey. To this union twelve children were born, three of whom died when babies. The surviving children are: Rome Carey, of Tipton; James Carey, of Dekalb, Texas; Mrs. Al Burrell, of near Pisgah; Mrs. Henry Frank, Mrs. Bud Williams, Wren, George, Ed, and John Carey, all of Speed. Besides the children she leaves to mourn her death the aged husband, one brother, John Russell, of this city, and one sister, Mrs. Delila Reeves, of Indiana.

The funeral, conducted by Elder Allen, was held Saturday morning at the Union church at Speed,

at eleven o'clock. Interment in Moore cemetery.
