AGED MONROE LADY FOUND DEAD IN BED

MRS. ELLEN MILLER PASSES
AWAY WHILE ALONE IN HOME--
HEART TROUBLE CAUSE.

Mrs. Ellen Miller, a resident of this city for many years, was found dead in bed at 8 o'clock this morning, at her home, 801 Main street, where she resided alone, by her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Fred W. Miller, Mrs. Miller going to the home on an errand, failed to get an answer to her calls and going to the outside window of the bedroom of the aged lady, saw her lying there in death. Mrs. Miller hastily summoned her husband and he forced an entrance to the door. The deceased had probably been dead for twenty hours. The last time she was seen was on Saturday afternoon. She had been subject to heart attacks and probably had a fatal attack some time Sunday.

Mrs. Miller was born in Ohio on August 20, 1839, and came here when quite young. She is survived by five children: Mrs. Anna Drake, of Corbett, Kansas, Mrs. Theo Hargis, of Burlington, Wis., Mrs. Nellie Swanson, of Corona, Cal., George Miller, of Moline, Ill., and Fred W. Miller, of this city. She also leaves a sister, Mrs. Richard Ellis, and a brother, Richard Bowden, of Jordan township.
