

## MRS. MEDORA E. SCOTT DIES

Was Native of Cooper County. Leaves One Son and One Daughter Surviving Her Death.

### ILL FOR SEVERAL WEEKS.

Mrs. Medora Ellen Scott died at her home, 613 south Fourth street, on Wednesday morning, April 17, at the age of sixty-six years. Funeral services will be held at the family home Friday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock and interment at Walnut Grove cemetery. Funeral services will be conducted by Rev. C. M. Truex, who was pastor of the Boonville Baptist church some years ago.

Mrs. Scott's husband died about twenty one years ago. She is survived by one son, Harvey Scott, and a daughter, Miss Ruth Scott, both of whom are at home. Mrs. Scott, whose former name was Parker, was born in Cooper county on April 12, 1852, and resided in the county all her life. She was the youngest of ten children of the Parker family and has one brother, Ben Parker, who resides at Clarksburg, Mo. She was ill for several weeks prior to her death. She bore her sufferings with that fortitude characteristic of the sincere christian. Her death removes from the community one of the old and esteemed citizens.
