MRS. PHILIPINE SCHACK DEAD.

Boonville Woman Had Been in Poor Health for Years.

Mrs. Philippine Schack, wife of Christian Schack, died at her home here Wednesday night. Mrs. Schack had been in ill health for a number of years. The funeral will be held Friday afternoon from the home, thence to the Evangelical Church where the Rev. Frederick Schlinkman will conduct the services. She was a member of the Evangelical Church. Mrs. Otilie Schreiner, of Brooklyn, N. Y., came here a year ago to help care for her mother and was here at her death.

Mrs. Schack was born in Ruessingen, Rhinepalz, Germany, December 26, 1848. She came to America in 1866 and was married to Christian Schack in New York City. They came to Boonville, December 3, 1869. Thirteen children were born to the union, five of whom survive, two sons and three daughters.

Mrs. Matthew Grissum Dead.

Mrs. Matthew Grissum, aged resident of this county, died at her home, south of Boonville, Monday. She was the widow of Matthew Grissum, who was drowned a year ago in a small creek near his home.

The funeral of Mrs. Grissum was held from the Mt. Hermon church, Wednesday, conducted by the Reverend Hedrick, of Prairie Home. Interment was in the church cemetery. One son, Henry Grissum, survives.

Former Resident Buried Here.

Joseph Stutman, who for many years was a resident of Boonville, died in Columbia this week. The body was brought here Wednesday for burial. Funeral services were held from the Evangelical Church conducted by the Rev. Frederick Schlinkmann and interment was made in Walnut Grove cemetery. Members of the local post of the G. A. R. of which Mr. Stutman was a member, took part in the services at the cemetery. Several children survive Mr. Stutman.
