DEMISE OF MRS. LEE JORDAN

Nearly every member of the family were down with influenza. Including the deceased, the first of this month and there were two deaths, the son-in-law, W. C. Hiltson and the youngest child of the household from the disease.

Mrs. Jordan's attack resulted in bronchial pneumonia and for the past month she has been very ill, the attack having been serious from the first.

The remains were shipped this afternoon to Waubesa, Hickory county, the former home of the family for interment.

The deceased's maiden name was Foster, a native of Missouri and she was a sister of J. B. Foster of the county on rural route No. 2.
