## Funeral of Phillip Barnett.

The funeral of Phillip J. Barnett, former Sedalian, who died Saturday morning at his home in Kansas City, was held at 3 o'clock this afternoon at the home of his father, George W. Barnett, 500 West Broadway. Rev. A. W. Kokendoffer, pastor of the First Christian church conducted the services.

A quartette, composed of Mesdames H. O. Foraker, C. C. Kelly, E. F. Yancey and C. H. Bard rendered the song service, and the following friends were pallbearers: Wallace May, Don Lamm, Victor Miller, Allen Fleming, Gould Sturges and Ernest Sibert.

The body arrived in Sedalia at midnight Sunday, accompanied by the widow, Bruce, Paul and Lawrence Barnett, brothers of the deceased, and Cyrus and Susan Barnett, children of Bruce Barnett. George Barnett, another brother, arrived from Webster Groves to attend the funeral, as did his sister, Mrs. Edwin Evans and Mr. Evans of Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

## Milton A. Burford.

Milton A. Burford, aged 67 years, died at 7 o'clock Sunday morning at the M. K. and T. hospital after an illness lasting several months, due to complications.

Mr. Burford was born in Virginia and came to Missouri when a small child. He lived in Otterville until

about seven years ago when he moved to Sedalia, residing at 1306 East Ninth street. He was an employe at the Missouri Pacific shops.
