MURDER CHARGE
AGAINST RENISON

**CORONER'S JURY FOUND WILL
JOBE MET DEATH FROM PIS-
TOL WOUND INFLICTED BY
RUPERT RENISON.**

William T. Bellamy, county pro-
secutor, will ask the first degree
murder penalty against Rupert
Renison, a farmer living in the Wan-
amaker neighborhood, who was ar-
rested yesterday afternoon by Sher-
iff John Logsdon and G. R. Smith,
deputy sheriff. Renison is charged
with killing his uncle, Will Jobe,
about noon Sunday on the farm of
Charley Renison, father of the ac-
cused. Jobe was shot to death with
a revolver.

The arrest of Renison came follow-
ing the report of the coroner's jury
which stated that Jobe met his death
from a pistol wound inflicted by
Rupert Renison. The examination
was conducted yesterday afternoon
at Wanamaker by Dr. B. C. Brad-
shaw, coroner.

Renison was brought to Marshall
late yesterday afternoon. Bail in
the sum of \$10,000 was arranged at
once and Renison made the bond.
The preliminary hearing has been
set for Thursday, June 1, but Mr.
Bellamy said it would be continued
because circuit court is in session.
The preliminary is before John Blair
justice of the peace.
