

PILOT GROVE WOMAN DEAD

Mrs. J. C. Rennison, 81 Years Old,
Passed Away Wednesday Morning

Mrs. J. C. Rennison died at her home in Pilot Grove, following a paralytic stroke, which occurred Wednesday morning. She was 81 years old.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon, from the Pilot Grove Methodist church, the Rev. A. H. Stephens, of Bunceton, in charge. Rev. Stephens was assisted by the Rev. J. R. Scott, pastor of the Pilot Grove Methodist church. Special music was rendered by the choir, composed of Mrs. Griffin Olson, Mrs. James Woods, Steve Stites, and William Deck.

Mary Angelina Fleman was born in Tennessee on April 20, 1843, being a daughter of Joseph and Mary Fleman. She came to Missouri as a small child with her parents, and located in Cedar county, where they remained until the beginning of the Civil War, when they came to Cooper county.

In November, 1874, she became the wife of J. C. Rennison at Boonville. To this union were born two daughters, America, deceased wife of George Maddex, and Agnes, deceased wife of the late John McCarty.

Mr. and Mrs. Rennison had had the care of three of their grandchildren, all of whom attended the funeral. They are: W. B. Maddex and Ruby Maddex and Irene Gilden, all of Kansas City. Besides the above named grandchildren, she leaves her husband and two grandchildren: Misses Mildred and Olive McCarty, of Pilot Grove.

Mrs. Rennison was a consistent member of the Presbyterian church and lived a fine Christian life. She was well-loved in her home community and those who are bereaved by her demise have the sincere sympathy of many friends.
