

Mrs. Sarah J. Lewis Passed Away April 23

Mrs. Sarah Jane Lewis died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Nelson Betteridge, near Bunceton, Thursday, April 23. Funeral services were held at the Antioch Baptist Church Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. J. B. Bomar, of Tipton. Burial was in Antioch cemetery.

Sarah Jane Spillers was born in Randolph county, Indiana, January 25, 1852. In girlhood, she went with her parents to Iowa, later moving to Cooper county, where she had since resided. She was one of a family of thirteen children, and is survived by four brothers and five sisters, who were present at the funeral, with the exception of a brother, W. H. Spillers, of Wichita, Kansas, and a sister, Mrs. Martha Mann, of Eads, Colo.

On February 26, 1874, she was united in marriage with John Will Lewis, who preceded her in death nineteen years ago. To this union, five sons and two daughters were born. The eldest son, W. H., died in 1914, and the youngest in infancy. Two daughters, Mrs. O. L. Cook, of Chilhowee, and Mrs. W. N. Betteridge, of Bunceton, and three sons, Elza, of Warrensburg; C. P., of Sedalia, and H. E., of Otterville, survive.

Mrs. Lewis united with Antioch Church at the age of thirty and lived a consistent Christian life.
