Samuel B. Osborn, 72 years old, died at 12:30 o'clock this afternoon at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Lon Ganger, 503 Wilson avenue, from a complication of ailments. Mr. Osborn was born in Wisconsin but had lived in Goshen nearly all of his life. He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Ganger and Mrs. Elijah Cripe, also of Goshen, two sons, Frank W. Osborn, of Elkhart and Ralph Osborn, of South Bend. His wife died three years ago last February.

Mr. Osborn served in the Spanish-American war as a member of Co. C, 157th Indiana Volunteers, and was a member of Slade Camp, Spanish-American War Veterans.

Funeral arrangements will be made later.

**AGED WOMAN SERIOUSLY  
BURNED THIS MORNING****MRS. SAMUEL OSBORN MAY DIE  
FROM INJURIES****Clothing Caught Fire While She Was  
Standing Near Stove in Her  
Home.**

Mrs. Samuel B. Osborn, 73 years old, was probably fatally burned at eight o'clock this morning, at her home on South Wilson avenue, when her clothing caught fire from the stove in the kitchen. Her clothing was practically burned from her body, and she is covered with burns. Dr. S. A. Edmonds, who was called, said that her condition is extremely serious. Mrs. Osborn's daughter, Mrs. Lon Ganger, who lives next door, at 503 Wilson avenue, was also severely burned in trying to extinguish the flames. Mrs. Ganger's hair, hands, face and throat were badly burned.

Mrs. Osborn had placed a small shawl around her shoulders and was standing with her back to the kitchen range. The shawl, coming in contact with the stove, was set on fire, and the remainder of Mrs. Osborn's clothing caught fire before she was aware of it. She called to her husband, but he was in the cellar at the time, and did not hear her. Mrs. Osborn then ran out the rear door, calling for help, and was met by her daughter, Mrs. Ganger, who seized several small rugs, and finally succeeded in extinguishing the flames, but not before both had been very badly burned.

Mrs. Osborn was carried to the Ganger home and a doctor was called. Mrs. Osborn also has another daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Cripe, of Goshen, and two sons, Frank Osborn, of Elkhart, and Ralph Osborn, of South Bend.

**MRS. SAMUEL OSBORN SUCCEUMBS  
TO BURNS RECEIVED MONDAY**

Mrs. Samuel Osborn, aged 73, died last evening at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Lon Ganger, 503 Wilson avenue from burns received yesterday morning when her clothing caught fire at her own home, 505 Wilson avenue. The accident occurred about seven o'clock. Mrs. Osborn was standing in front of a cook stove when a light shawl, which she wore, caught fire and quickly ignited the rest of her clothing. Her husband was in the basement and did not hear her call so she ran next door to the home of Mrs. Ganger who did all in her power to extinguish the flames and was quite badly burned in the attempt.

The deceased was born in Yorkshire, England, but has lived here for the past forty years.

Surviving are her husband, Samuel Osborn, two daughters, Mrs. Lon Ganger and Mrs. Elijah Cripe, two sons, Frank Osborn of Elkhart and Ralph of South Bend, eight grandchildren, one great-grandchild and one sister, Mrs. Sarah Walker of Batavia, N. Y.

Funeral services will be held Thursday at three o'clock from the home of the daughter, Mrs. Ganger, 503 Wilson avenue, Rev. O. V. Rector officiating. Burial in Oak Ridge.
