George R. Spillers.

George R. Spillers, aged about 69 years, died at his home 717 East Fifth street at 2:25 o'clock Monday morning following an illness of the past three weeks.

Mr. Spillers was born in Cooper County, September 20, 1858. On October 13, 1881, he was married to Miss Etta Amick of Cooper County.

He was a member of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and the Security Benefit Association.

Mr. Spillers was one of the best known and universally liked engineers on the M-K-T lines out of Sedalia. He had been on the retired list for about a year.

Surviving is the widow and two sons, Harry and Roy Spillers, of this city; three grandchildren, Jack Spillers of Jefferson City, Miss Melita Spillers, and "Bill" Spillers of the home address. A son, Clark Spillers, died April 19, of this year.

Three brothers, Charles Spillers of Sedalia, William Spillers of Boger, Texas, Pete Spillers of LaMonte and five sisters, Mrs. J. Q. Quinmeal of Cooper County, Mrs. Ida Thomas of Pilot Grove, Mrs. Etta Brooks of Leeton; Mrs. Sam Sparks of Sedalia, and Mrs. Martha Mann of Amarillo, Texas, also survive.

The funeral will be held at 2:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at the East Sedalia Baptist church.

Rev. W. B. McGraw, pastor, will officiate.

Burial will be in Crown Hill cemetery.
