Mrs. A. J. Powell Dead.

Mrs. Lizzie Hannah Powell died Monday morning at 4 a. m. at Fitzgibbon hospital, where she was taken last Wednesday. An operation was necessary, which was performed Saturday morning, and the patient died at the time stated above.

Mrs. Powell was the daughter of John B. and Sallie E. Davis, and was born in Saline County September 9, 1862. She was married to the surviving husband, A. J. Powell, May 29, 1883. To this union were born three children all of whom survive, John William of the home address, Mrs. Annie E. Laytham and Mrs. Carrie Laxon of Marshall. She is also survived by three sisters and four brothers, Mrs. Sam Cochran of the county; Mrs. Will Heckman, Napton; Mrs. Levina Walker, California; J. R. Davis, Independence, Joe B. Davis, county... Monroe Davis, Kansas City, and Boyd Davis of the county.

Mrs. Powell united with the Baptist church a number of years ago, and lived a consistent Christian life.

Funeral services will be conducted by Rev. B. T. Reed of Blackwater at 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon from the home of Mrs. John Laytham in the southwestern suburbs of the city. Burial will be at Ridge Park.

W. B. Marshall Dead.

W. B. (Billie) Marshall, a prominent farmer died at noon (Monday) at his home about two miles east of Wanamaker after a two week's illness of kidney trouble.

Mr. Marshall was 45 years old, and was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Marshall, who during their life time, were prominently identified with the business and social life of their community, and reared a large family at the old homestead just west of the home of the deceased.

Mr. Marshall was married December 25, 1907 to Mary Keys, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Keys, and to them were born four children, Mary Ellen, Martha Will Wort and Joe Ayers, who survive the father.

He is also survived by the two brothers and four sisters, Al and Scott Marshall of the Wanamaker community, Mrs. Walter Pile of Marshall, Mrs. Joe Scott of Napton, Mrs. Nettie Pile and Mrs. Edgar Meredith of Oklahoma.
