

## Fred Hagemeyer of Near Bunceton Dies

Passed Away Christmas Day After  
Suffering 3 Days From a  
Paralytic Stroke

Fred Hagemeyer, a farmer living five miles southwest of Bunceton, died Christmas Day at 11 o'clock, after having been critically ill since Sunday when he suffered a paralytic stroke.

Funeral services were held Friday morning at 10 o'clock at the home and at 11:30 at the Lone Elm Lutheran Church, both services conducted by Rev. J. W. Schoech, of Lone Elm. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Mr. Hagemeyer was born in St. Louis August 7, 1853, but had lived in Cooper County since 1881, being successfully engaged in farming. He was married to Miss Lizzie Loesing on April 2, 1876, and is survived by her and six children: Mrs. Lizzie Day, Kansas City; Mrs. Frank Meyer, near Bunceton; Mrs. Emma Stegner, of near Mt. Hermon church, this county; Emil Hagemeyer, Sedalla; Harry Hagemeyer, southwest of Bunceton, and Mrs. C. C. Waller, Wright City. A daughter, Mrs. George Buschhorn, died a number of years ago.

Besides the widow and children Mr. Hagemeyer is survived by 12 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, one half-brother, Charles Dix, and two sisters, Mrs. Minnie Johnson and Mrs. Christine Schleuter, of St. Louis.

Mr. Hagemeyer was a faithful member of the Lone Elm church and a citizen of splendid attributes of character, who was highly esteemed by all who knew him.
