

James O. Lewis of Otterville is Dead

James O. Lewis died at his home in Otterville Thursday morning April 24, 1930, at the age of 74 years. Funeral services were held at the home Friday afternoon conducted by the Rev. L. M. Pollock, pastor of the M. E. church, at Green Ridge, and former pastor at Otterville. Burial followed in the Otterville I. O. O. F. Cemetery. ✓

Mr. Lewis was born Oct. 3, 1855, in Cooper County, where he spent his entire life. He was married to Miss Dora Thomas of Cooper County Dec. 23, 1879. Mr. Lewis is survived by his widow, one son, W. O. Lewis, of the home; three brothers, T. J. Lewis, Blackwater; J. F. Lewis, Bunceton; A. L. Lewis, Clinton; and one sister, Mrs. Bettie Patrick, Sedalia.

Mr. Lewis was one of the most highly esteemed citizens of Otterville. He united with the Cumberland Presbyterian church at New Lebanon at the age of 26, to which faith he was loyal, and lived a Christian life. The pallbearers were the three brothers and three cousins, Neale Goode, Emmett Lewis, and Lee Lewis.
