

## Joe Smith, Formerly of Peninsula Dies

Falling Health for a Year Fatal;  
Funeral Held Monday  
at Noon

Joe Smith of Kansas City died Saturday at a hospital there after having been in falling health for a year. He had been at the hospital for several weeks. Funeral services were held at the Peninsula church Monday at 12 o'clock
