

Salt Fork Home Coming Was Sunday

Between 350 and 400 Attend Annual Meeting Held at Old Church

Between 350 and 400 people enjoyed the annual home-coming held Sunday at an all-day meeting at Salt Fork Church, three miles west of Blackwater. Because of the intense heat, it was estimated that only about half of the usual crowd attended. The meeting started in the morning with a program of readings and music in charge of Uncas McGuire. Following this W. L. Nelson addressed the crowd. The basket dinner, the feature of the occasion was enjoyed at noon.

In the afternoon Rev. Clinton Cox of Chicago, presbyterian minister, addressed the audience. Rev. Cox was reared in the Salt Fork community and at one time was pastor of the church there. His talk principally was reminiscences of former days. The Salt Fork home-coming is one of the most enjoyable annual affairs in the county. It is sponsored yearly by the Salt Fork Cemetery Association, which keeps the interest in the community alive by the meeting. The church building, no longer used for worship, is now a community center.
