

Mrs. E. C. Hill, 80 Years Old, Dies

Pioneer Pilot Grove Woman Died at
Her Home Friday
Morning

Mrs. E. C. Hill, 80-year-old pioneer resident of Pilot Grove died suddenly at her home there Friday morning, Sept. 12. She had not been seriously ill.

Hannah McCommas Maddox, daughter of John and Mariah Maddox, was born March 20, 1850, in Clark County, W. Va. When a small child she moved with her parents to Columbia, and in 1877 she with her mother and brother, moved to a farm near Pilot Grove. She was married to E. C. Hill of the Pilot Grove community, March 7, 1880, and they lived on a farm near Pilot Grove until 1914 when they moved to Pilot Grove.

Mrs. Hill was a charter member of the Mt. Vernon Presbyterian Missionary Society and a member of the Old Mt. Vernon Presbyterian church. She was a life long member of the Presbyterian faith. Her family was one of the pioneer families of the Pilot Grove community.

Mrs. Hill is survived by her husband and one daughter, Mrs. Charles Schlotzhauer, of Pilot Grove, also one grandson, Milton Schlotzhauer, of Pilot Grove. Two children, a son and a daughter died in infancy.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at 2:30 at the Pilot Grove Presbyterian church by the Rev. Frank Brewster, of Marshall, and burial was in the Pilot Grove cemetery.

In the passing of this aged resident, Pilot Grove has lost one of its pioneer mothers who was beloved by all who knew her.
