

James G. Hill, 75 of Clarksburg Dies

James G. Hill, 75 year old, was found dead on the back porch of his home in Clarksburg—early Monday morning. Mr. Hill, who had been in very poor health for many months, was living alone, and had gone to the porch with a broom in his hands, when he fell, presumably Sunday evening. From all indications he was dead when he fell. He was the grandfather of Mrs. Lewis Elliott, and Roscoe, Jim and Joe Albert of this community. Funeral services, conducted by the Rev. Swinney, Baptist minister of Clarksburg were held at Mt. Pleasant Baptist church late Tuesday afternoon for Mr. Hill. Owing to the almost impassable condition of the roads only a few of his many friends were able to attend.

Mr. Hill was one of 13 children, all of whom, except one brother, preceded him in death. He was twice married and twice bereft of his companion. He was the father of three children, one son, Vellard, and two daughters, Laura and Pernie, all of whom preceded him in death. He is survived by a brother, Charles Hill, and a number of grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Mr. Hill celebrated his seventy-fifth birthday Feb. 14. Following the services at the church, the remains were interred in the family lot in Mt. Pleasant cemetery. Pallbearers were six grandsons: Jim and Joe Albert, Henry and Willie Hill and Fred and Leonard Powell.
