Mrs. Eliza J. Steele Thomas died at her home in New Lebanon, Wednesday, Jan. 13. Funeral services, pallbearers, Millard Stahl and Earl home with burial being made in the New Lebanon Cemetery. Services were in charge of the Rev. M. J. Berquist, pastor of the Mt. Nebo Baptist church. The following were pallbearers: Mildred Stahl and Earl Thomas of Syracuse, George Thomas of Sedalia, Ray Thomas of Clarksburg, Jonas Thomas and Jimmy Thomas of Buncheon.

Mrs. Thomas was born Aug. 7, 1851, on a farm north of Otterville and was 80 years old at the time of her death. On Dec. 27, 1871, she was married to A. G. T. Thomas. They were the parents of seven children, four of whom, with Mr. Thomas, preceded her in death. She is survived by one daughter, Miss Ina Thomas of the home and by two sons, C. L.
