## Former Boonvillian Dies In California

Funeral Services For Mrs. Fannie  
B. Walz, Were Held In Los  
Angeles.

John L. O'Bryan received word Tuesday of the death of his sister, Mrs. Fannie B. Walz, at 10:45 that morning at her home in Los Angeles, Calif. Funeral services will be held in Los Angeles, though the time of the rites was not learned today.

Mrs. Walz was born in Cooper County the daughter of John L. and Elizabeth Bousefield O'Bryan, pioneer Missouri couple, on the Bousefield place six miles south of Boonville. She grew to womanhood here and was married to Irving Mack, who died several years ago. She married Leopold Walz, who preceded her in death in March, 1926.

Mrs. Walz is survived by a son of her first marriage, Irving Mack, and a grandson, Irving Mack, Jr., of St. Louis, and by a brother and sister, John L. O'Bryan of Boonville, and Mrs. James A. Riordan of Los Angeles, Calif. Mr. Walz was a brother of John, Charles, and Miss Julia Walz and Mrs. W. E. Sombart, of Boonville.
