J. C. RENNISON DIES.

Long Time Resident of Pilot Grove
Dies Thursday in Kansas City.

Mr. J. C. Rennison, who for a period of 40 years lived in Pilot Grove, became ill a few weeks ago and was taken to Kansas City from which point word was received Thursday morning that he had died at 7:30 o'clock. The funeral services will be held in Pilot Grove from the Methodist Church South, Rev. H. H. S. DuBois will preach the funeral sermon.

Mr. Rennison has been a resident of Cooper County practically his entire life. Prior to his coming to Pilot Grove he lived at Belle Air. Of recent years he has conducted a shoe repair shop in Pilot Grove. He was 83 years of age according to best information obtainable. He had no immediate family but was cared for in the past few weeks by his grandchildren in Kansas City.

He had five grandchildren: Mrs. William Schuster and Miss Mildred McCarty of Pilot Grove, Mr. Wm. T. Maddex, Miss Ruby Maddex and Mrs. Weldon Gates of Kansas City.

Mr. Rennison was universally liked here where he had many friends who will grieve at his passing.
