## Mrs. J. F. Lewis Of Bunceton Died

Funeral Services Were Held From  
Pisgah Baptist Church Friday  
Morning.

Mrs. J. F. Lewis died at her home in Bunceton at 12:25 on June 1. Mrs. Lewis had been ill for several months suffering from an infection on her face.

Miss Margaret Edna King was born June 9, 1866, in Moniteau county at Centertown and when a child moved with her parents to Cooper county, near Otterville. She was united in marriage to J. F. Lewis of Otterville, November 8, 1888. To this union was born seven children, six of which survive: Aura Lee of Pontiac, Mich., Mrs. Edgar Carpenter, Mrs. Harry Wilson, Mrs. Farris Floyd, Mrs. W. H. Tomy, and Miss Lucile Lewis all of Bunceton. One daughter, Miss Minnie, died in 1914 at the age of twenty-one.

Mrs. Lewis was a member of the Bunceton Methodist church. Funeral services were held from the Pisgah Baptist church Saturday morning at 10 o'clock. Services were in charge of Rev. T. M. Macdonnell of California. Burial was in the Pisgah cemetery.

## Mrs. Mary Finley, 86, Dies Sunday

Pioneer Boonville Woman Passes

Tuesday.

Mrs. Mary Catherine Finley, 86 years old, died at her farm home, Sunday, June 4.

On Saturday, May 27, she fractured her hip and has been ill since. She was the eldest daughter of Oscar and Cornelia Weight and was born on February 15, 1847. She was educated in the early Boonville schools and colleges including Buckner's and Aephae colleges.

On October 24, 1867 she was married to John Finley and has lived since then east of Boonville. When a young girl she joined the Boonville Baptist church.

She is survived by three children, Mrs. John Hoberrecht, Weight Finley and Mrs. Arch Farris of Bunceton; and by the following grandchildren, Milton Hoberrecht, Ray Hoberrecht, Wilbur Finley, John William Finley, Mrs. Henry Pyles, Ray Finley and Albert Finley and one sister, Mrs. John P. Glazier.

Funeral services were from the Boonville Baptist church Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock with services in charge of the Rev. B. A. Owen. Interment was in the Walnut Grove cemetery.
