FUNERAL OF J. C. COLE AT TIPTON

John C. Cole, 73 years old, died at his home southeast of Tipton Sunday, his death occurring on the farm where 75 years of his life had been spent. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the Baptist church, Rev. W. B. McGraw of California, and Rev. Pierce, pastor of the Tipton church officiating.

The hymns were played by Mrs. Roy Conn, and sung by a quartet composed of Messrs. Phillips, Pierce, Maynard and Ray White, the latter also singing a solo.

Interment was in the Mt. Moriah cemetery with Messrs. Preston Hays, Ed. Schmidt, E. A. Snodgrass, Norman Hatcher, Logan Vaughn and Charles Dillinger as pallbearers.

Mr. Cole was born in Illinois, coming with his parents in Missouri in early life. He was a man of neighborly qualities and had en-

gaged in farming and stockraising all his life.

He leaves his widow who was Miss Jones before their marriage, and one son, Oscar Cole of the home.
