## Mrs. Lee Land Died Early Monday

Funeral Services Were Tuesday at 2:30 pm at the  
Campbell-Lewis Funeral Chapel.

Mrs. Lee Land died at 8:10 o'clock Mon. morning at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Claude Laxson, corner of North Franklin and Ohio Streets, where she was taken Saturday from Fitzgibbon Hospital. Mrs. Land had been failing in health since November, entering the hospital two weeks ago for treatment.

Mirinda Renison Land was born in the eastern part of the County, July 14, 1877. She was first married to Wade Land, and after his death she was married to Lee Land, a brother of her first husband. Mr. Lee Land died July 12, 1937. To the first union two children were born, Mrs. Laxson and Ray Land, and to the second union a son, Kenneth Land, all of whom survive. Since her husband's death she had made her home with her son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Ray Land, near Napton.

One sister, Mrs. Moriah Cartner of Boonville survives.

Mrs. Land had spent her entire life in the Nelson and Napton communities, and had a host of friends, who are saddened by her death. To her family she was devoted and considerate, doing many things for their pleasure and happiness.

She was a loyal member of the Smith Chapel Methodist church.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Campbell-Lewis funeral chapel, conducted by the Rev. T. A. Huffine, whose message brought comfort to the grieved family and friends.

A quartet from the Smith chapel church, composed of Lester Tichenor, June Baker, Leonard T. Stouffer and Charles Sprigg, accompanied by Mrs. June Baker, sang "Beautiful Isle of Somewhere" and "God Be With You 'Til We Meet Again." Mr. Baker sang "Shadows" as a solo.

Burial was at Ridge Park cemetery and the pallbearers were John Morris, John Heckman, Walter Miller, Burr Owsley, Oliver Laxson, and Judge C. B. Davis.
