Alvin W. Nicol, 76, Buried Wednesday

Funeral services were held Wednesday at the Presbyterian church at 2 o'clock for Alvin W. Nicol, who died at his home at 615 High street Monday evening at 8 o'clock. Mr. Nicol had been ill for several months.

The services were conducted by the Rev. D. F. Murphy, pastor of the Presbyterian church. Burial was in the Walnut Grove cemetery under the direction of Goodman & Boller. The Knights of Pythias lodge had charge of the short services at the grave in Walnut Grove. Mr. Nicol was a 50-year veteran of Golden Gate lodge No. 91 here.

He came to Boonville as a young man from Palmyra, Mo., and was engaged in a number of commercial enterprises before moving to Kansas City. He was associated with his brother-in-law, the late Charles Meierhofer, in the sand and gravel business for a number of years and for a time was in the lumber business in Boonville. He returned to Boonville several years ago where he has since made his home.

Mr. Nicol was born at Palmyra, Mo., on December 16, 1863, the son of Henry and Anna Brand Nicol.

He is survived by Mrs. Nicol and three sisters, Miss Helen Nicol, Kansas City; Mrs. Charles Meierhofer, Kansas City, and Mrs. Josie Bernard, Palmyra, Mo. Three sisters preceded his death.

Services Held for Jesse M. Mitchell

Funeral services for Jesse M. Mitchell, Jr., were held at 2:30 Tuesday afternoon at the Goodman-Boller chapel conducted by the Rev. Perry P. Taylor of the Methodist church. Burial was in Walnut Grove cemetery.

Mitchell, who was born in Boonville May 12, 1873, lived in Boonville nearly all his lifetime. He died at his home at 210 Morgan street at midnight Saturday after a four weeks' illness. Death was attributed to complications from pneumonia. He had been in ill health for more than a year.

Mitchell was a son of Jesse and Sarah Seat Mitchell. He received his education in the Boonville public schools before entering the express business here with his father. He worked for several years in St. Louis for Butler Bros. Mfg. company and also in Muskogee, Okla. For a number of years he was a taxicab operator here.

On Sept. 16, 1895, he married Miss Atha L. Mills of Boonville, who survives, together with a daughter, Mrs. Jacob Deck, Jr., and two sisters, Miss Mollie Mitchell of Boonville and Mrs. Minor Harrington of Paducah, Ky.
