

Services Held for Nathan A. Smith

OTTERVILLE—Funeral services were held at the Presbyterian church here Monday afternoon for Nathan Allen Smith, 81, who died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Roy Pile, Liberal, Kan., Friday. The services were conducted by the Rev. R. A. Waggoner of the Bradway Presbyterian Church in Sedalia. Burial was in the T. O. O. F. cemetery here.

Mr. Smith is survived by three sons and two daughters; Shields R. Smith, St. Louis; Bane Smith, Ordway, Colo.; Berry Smith, Montrose, Colo.; Mrs. T. S. Ellis, Beaman; and Mrs. Pile. He also is survived by a sister, Mrs. Mattie White, Otterville, nine grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Mr. Smith had made his home with Mrs. Pile for about two years. He was born in Otterville, Sept. 8, 1858, and lived in or near Otterville practically all his life. He was married to Miss Alice Bane, Oct. 7, 1880. Mrs. Smith died in June, 1929.
