C. W. Kirton, 80, Dies of Heart Trouble

Charles William Kirton, lifelong resident of Boonville and for more than 40 years drawbridge tender for the Katy railroad here, died of a heart attack at his home at 401 West Spring street at 7:40 a. m. Wednesday. He was 80 years old.

Mr. Kirton had been in ill health since his retirement from the railroad position in 1924 and recently had suffered a series of minor heart attacks.

He was born in Boonville Jan. 6, 1861, a son of T. H. and Elizabeth Jane Kirton, and was the last of a family of eleven children, nine sisters and one brother having preceded him in death. He married Miss Minnie Dilthey in Boonville Dec. 21, 1898. He is survived by Mrs. Kirton and one son, C. W. Kirton, Jr., a member of the Daily News staff. He also leaves a nephew, Roy Randecker, of Galveston, Tex.

Mr. Kirton was a member of the Episcopal church.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 Friday afternoon in the Goodman & Boller chapel. Burial will be in Walnut Grove cemetery.
