DOUTT SERVICES HELD

Funeral for Chrisman Physical Ed Instructor Were Held Tuesday at First Baptist Church.

The faculty of the William Chrisman High School attended the funeral services of Miss Marjorie Doult at the First Baptist Church at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. Miss Doult, who lived at 1500 South Noland Road, was a physical culture director at the high school. She died at the Vineyard Park Hospital in Kansas City Saturday, after a short illness from appendicitis.

The service was conducted by the Rev. Harold M. Hunt, the pastor. Music was directed by Miss Jessie Smith, music supervisor of the high school. The organist was Mrs. Ruby Reeder, and the pianist, Miss Beatrice Butterworth. Singers were Miss Melba Moorman, Miss Doris Thatcher and Miss Veta Minton, who sang "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Going Home."

The pallbearers were J. C. Truman, C. H. Huhn, H. C. Dean, Earl L. Phillips, Ray F. French and J. A. Biter, all of the Chrisman faculty.

Burial was in Mount Washington Cemetery.

DOUTT SERVICE TUESDAY

Funeral of Chrisman Teacher Will Be at First Baptist Church—Death Follows Week's Illness.

Funeral services for Miss Marjorie Doult, 33 years old, girls' physical education director at the William Chrisman High School for the past three years, will be conducted at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at the First Baptist Church. The burial will be in Mt. Washington Cemetery. The body will be at the church from 1 to 2 o'clock.

Miss Doult, who lived at 1500 South Noland Road, died late Saturday at the Vineyard Park Hospital in Kansas City where she underwent an appendectomy last Thursday. She had only been ill for a week. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel B. Doult and had been a resident of Independence all of her life, attending school here and graduating in 1932 from the Central Missouri State Teachers' College at Warrensburg. Miss Doult taught at the McCoy and Bryant schools.

Besides her parents, Miss Doult is survived by three brothers, William A. Doult, 1400 South Noland Road, industrial arts teacher at the West Junior High School, Kansas City; Thomas W. Doult, 1307 Ash Avenue, a teacher at the Blenheim School, Kansas City, and Marvin W. Doult, 1510 South Noland Road; and two sisters, Mrs. Lois Bradshaw, a matron at the McCune Home for Boys, and Mrs. Thelma Linson, 811 South Liberty Street.

MARJORIE DOUTT'S DEATH LEAVES MANY SAD HEARTS

Miss Marjorie Doult, who for four years has been in charge of the girls' physical education classes at William Chrisman, died August 16, 1941. She underwent an operation for appendicitis after a few days illness and medical science could not save her.

Persistence and patience were the characteristics that had won for Miss Doult the place she held. She was graduated from William Chrisman in 1927 and having decided to become a teacher of physical education entered the State Teachers College at Warrensburg. She was graduated from there in 1932 and was elected to teach here in Independence school system that winter after Christmas vacation, taking the place of Miss Charlene Jones at Bryant School. The next fall she was transferred to McCoy School where she taught until she was transferred to William Chrisman to take the place of Miss Ruth Bryant. She had spent two summers at Greeley, Colorado, working on her Master's Degree and was planning to return there next summer.

Miss Doult or "Teach," as she was lovingly called by all the girls, sponsored the "M" Club, the Pep Club and was one of the sponsors of the Junior Class last year.

She was gentle and kind in her work with the girls and boys, always urging them to show good sportsmanship in everything they did. Living up to what she tried to teach them, she was known as a good sport herself.

Her personality was one that grew stronger the longer one knew her and her influence will be felt for a long time in these old halls.
