

T. J. Back Buried Here Monday, Jan. 5

Terrence Jacob Back, former Boonville resident, died suddenly at his home in Kansas City, Kan., Saturday afternoon at 2:30. He had been in ill health for more than a year. He had been suffering from a heart ailment.

Funeral services were held at the Evangelical church Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. E. F. Abele, pastor of the

church. Burial was in the Walnut Grove cemetery. Services were conducted at 8 o'clock Sunday night in the Back home at Kansas City, Kan.

Mr. Back was born in Boonville, August 26, 1886, the son of Tony and Louise (Fessler) Back.

He was graduated from Boonville Public School and attended Kemper Military School.

Mr. Back was married Jan. 5, 1909, in Kansas City to Miss Edith Eoggs, of Kansas City. They resided in Boonville until 27 years ago, when they moved to Kansas City, Kan., and operated a luncheonette business at 1102 Osage Ave. until a few weeks ago.
