Maddox Rites Are Conducted

CLIFTON CITY—George Maddox, who made his home alone here, was found dead near a woodpile by near neighbors about 5 p. m. Thursday, March 30. It is supposed he had been chopping wood and suffered a heart attack. The coroner of Boonville was called and pronounced death to a heart ailment.

Mr. Maddox, who was the son of the late John and Hannah Maddox, was born at Pilot Grove on March 5, 1874. He attended school at Pilot Grove and later moved with his family to Bell Air. After the death of his wife several years ago he moved to Clifton City where he has made his home ever since.

He married Miss America Renison, also of Pilot Grove, and they had four children. One child died in infancy.

He is survived by two sons, who both reside in the state of California; one daughter, Mrs. Wendell Gates of Kansas City and two sisters, Mrs. Will Anthony of Otterville and Mrs. Jim Needy of Clifton City.

Funeral services were held at the Otterville funeral home Sunday afternoon at 2:30 p. m. with the Rev. Wood, pastor of the Methodist church at Otterville, officiating. Burial was made in Pilot Grove cemetery. ✓
