Funeral Services For
Aged Woman Was Friday
At Malta Bend Church

Mrs. George W. Little, 87, died at 7:35 p.m. Wed. Jan. 3 at her home, seven and one-half miles northeast of Malta Bend, where she had resided for sixty years. She had suffered a paralytic stroke December 14 and her condition had since been serious.

The Malta Bend Methodist Church was filled Friday afternoon for the funeral services.

The church pastor, the Rev. Lyman Firestone, delivered the funeral sermon, in which he paid a tribute to the life of Mrs. Little.

Lewis W. Shultz sang "Shadows" and a mixed quartet from the church choir furnished the remainder of the music.
