

Frank H. Smith Dies Unexpectedly

Frank H. Smith, 27, former Boonville street commissioner, died at his home at 416 Seventh street about 6:30 o'clock this morning. Although he had been ill for some time, his death was unexpected.

Funeral services will be conducted at the Goodman and Boller Funeral Chapel at 2 p. m. Sunday by the Rev. E. F. Abele, pastor of the Evangelical Church. Burial will be in Walnut Grove Cemetery. The local Oddfellows lodge, of which he was a member for more than 50 years, will have charge of the graveside rites.

Mr. Smith is survived by his widow, the former Miss Kate M. Yaeger, to whom he was married April 16, 1885; a daughter, Mrs. Ellis W. Davis, and a grandson, Wade Davis, all of the home.

Born at Bloomington, Pa., Sept. 15, 1860, he came to Boonville as a young man. He was a bridge worker and was employed on the old Katy bridge when it was built. He latter engaged in the transfer business here, and for a number of years served as city street commissioner.
