Former Clifton City Woman Dies

CLIFTON CITY—Funeral services were held Wednesday June 16 at the McLaughlin Funeral Home in Sedalia for Mrs. Charles Knox, who died Monday morning at the home of her daughter, Mrs. David Cramer, Sedalia.

Burial was in Memorial Cemetery. The Rev. Walter F. Arnold, pastor of the East Sedalia Baptist Church of which Mrs. Knox was a member, conducted the rites. Pallbearers were T. F. Jerrell, J. Gelken, H. S. Barman, J. H. Benedict, C. F. Neece, and F. Weathers.

Mrs. Knox was the former Miss Lila Geheringer, the daughter of the late Calvin and Sarah Geheringer. She was born on a farm near Clifton City in 1880, and lived all of her life in this community until the death of her husband in February, 1941, after which she went to Sedalia to make her home. She joined the Baptist Church there in March, 1941.

Surviving are three sons, George Knox and Chester Knox of Clifton City, and John Knox of Sedalia, and one daughter, Mrs. Cramer of Sedalia. She also leaves four brothers, Dewey Geheringer, New York, Lafe Geheringer, South Dakota, Theodore of Columbia, Mo., and Jimmie of Sedalia; and four sisters, Mrs. F. S. Needy and Mrs. J. H. Potter of Clifton City, Mrs. L. J. Potter, Otterville, and Mrs. Blanche Philips, Sweet Springs. A brother, Dudley Geheringer, died about six years ago.
