

Mrs. Sally Woolery Blythe

Funeral services for Mrs. Sally Woolery Blythe, 80, who died at 8:00 o'clock Monday morning at the home of her nephews, Ernest and S. L. Adams, of about two miles southeast of Knob Noster, will be held at 12:00 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at the Presbyterian church in Knob Noster with the Rev. O. A. Blaylock, pastor of the Pleasant Bethel church, officiating.

Miss Mary Hogan will be in charge of the music.

Following the services at Knob Noster, the body will be taken to Pleasant Green for services, which will be held at 2:30 o'clock at the Methodist church, one fourth mile off the farm to market road.

Burial will be held in Pleasant Green cemetery.

Mrs. Blythe was born February 13, 1869, the daughter of Joshua Taylor and Elizabeth Berry Woolery. On December 8, 1896, she married James Blythe, who preceded her in death in December 13, 1926. She had lived with her nephews for the past 14 years.

She was a member of the Mt. Nebo Baptist Church.
