## Renison Rites Held Thursday

Funeral Was Conducted  
by Reverend White at  
Miller's Chapel at 2 p. m.

Funeral services for Mrs. Amy R. Renison, who passed away Tuesday evening, were held at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon, July 21, at Miller's Chapel near Longwood conducted by the Rev. Walter J. White.
