Rites Thursday For Mrs. L. J. Ross

Funeral services for Mrs. Leo J. Ross, who died at St. Joseph's Hospital yesterday afternoon at 2:10 following a long illness, will be held at the Goodman and Bolter Chapel Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The Rev. E. F. Abele will conduct the rites, and burial will be in Walnut Grove cemetery. The body will remain at the funeral home until time for the services.

Mrs. Ross was born in Boonville, the eldest daughter of Henry P. and Nellie McCowan Sanders. She spent her entire life here. On June 27, 1928 she was married to Leo J. Ross.

She is survived by her husband; three brothers, Harry Sanders of Little Rock, Ark., Elmer Sanders, San Francisco, Calif., and Lester Sanders of Boonville; and by one sister, Mrs. Grace Mock, of Kansas City. She also leaves one niece and one nephew.

Mrs. Ross was a lifelong member of the Evangelical and Reformed church.
