

Short Illness Fatal To John Rentschler

John Rentschler died at the Haas Convalescent Home at 4 a. m. today. He became ill at his home 908 Shamrock Thursday morning.

Funeral services will be held at the Goodman and Boller Chapel Sunday at 2 p. m. The Rev. E. F. Abele will conduct the rites.

Burial will be in the Walnut Grove Cemetery.

The body will remain at the Funeral Home until time for the rites.

Mr. Rentschler was born in Cooper County, Dec. 19, 1873, the son of John and Barbara Zimmerman Rentschler, and spent all of his life in this community. He was engaged in farming in the Billingsville neighborhood until about 30 years ago, when he retired and moved to Boonville, where he has since made his home.

He is survived by one sister, Miss Minnie Rentschler, of the home, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Mr. Rentschler was a member of the Evangelical Church, having been confirmed in the Billingsville Church when a boy.
